Dear Dr. Schlieper

As discussed before, we would like to inform you about our experience concerning birth gels used during deliveries.

We started to use birth gel, named Dianatal in 2008, while we were participating in a scientific study. This study showed that birth gels may facilitate the delivery, especially the second stage of labor. Since one year ago we collected experiences with the "Natalis" birth gel, which was developed by your company. We noticed that the Natalis birth gel has very similar physical characteristics as Dianatal. It can cause a comparable facilitation of the second stage of labor. In addition, Natalis offers further advantages compared with Dianatal. The production of Natalis is based on natural ingredients. Dianatal, however, contains polyacrylic acid as basis. Furthermore, the essentially softer application catheter of Natalis should be mentioned.

Detailed information of the Natalis birth concept was kindly provided by you. In our opinion the Natalis birth concept including Prenatal, Antenatal and Postnatal treatments offers a significant advantage to every woman in labour during natural birth.
